CAMP KILLOOLEET - Hancock, VT www.killooleet.com

This camp is in a very rural part of Vermont, literally off the grid for cellphones etc. It takes about 100 boys and girls, ages 10-14, for a full (7-week) summer with an emphasis on cooperation rather than competition. Killlooleet offers swimming and diving (the camp has its own small lake), canoeing, hiking, horseback riding, soccer and baseball, drama, music and art. It has been run by the Seeger family for two generations. The current director, Kate Seeger, is a niece of the folksinger Pete Seeger and an accomplished musician herself. There is a lot of folk singing at Killlooleet.

NASHOBA NORTH - Raymond, ME www.campnashoba.com

This is another traditional co-ed camp, on the shores of Crescent Lake, about an hour from Portland, Maine. It is bit bigger and more sports-oriented than Killlooleet, with swimming, diving, water-skiing, soccer, baseball, hockey, lacrosse and basketball, among other things. It also offers music and arts. You can enroll for a four-week session or the whole summer.
